

QUESTIONS OR CONCERNS?

We understand that you may have questions or concerns about your procedure. Our staff is available to answer any questions. Please let us know how we may be of assistance. Our goal is to make your experience with us a positive one.

HOW SHOULD I PREPARE FOR MY CHILD'S SURGERY?

A parent or legal guardian must be present to consent to treatment at our facility while the patient is in surgery and recovery, so please plan accordingly. Out of respect to our patients, please limit children to those having a procedure. Be sure not to give any food or drinks the morning of the procedure.

DO I NEED SOMEONE TO DRIVE ME HOME AFTER MY SURGERY?

Yes! You must have a responsible adult with you to drive you home or accompany you if you plan to use an alternative mode of transportation. It is also a good idea to plan to have someone stay with you through the night once you are discharged.

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR THE DAY OF MY PROCEDURE?

Wear loose, comfortable clothing that you can change easily and will not bind the site of your surgery.

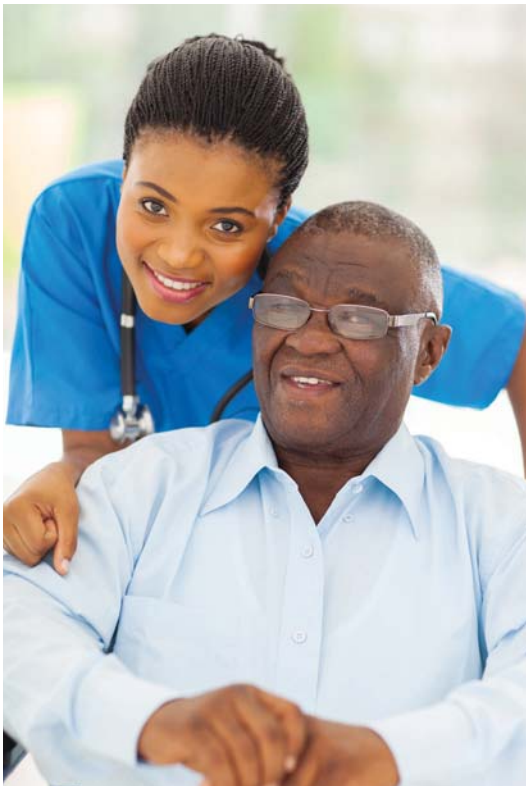


TOP QUALITY OUTPATIENT CARE

PRIOR TO YOUR EXPERIENCE

You will receive a call from a pre-admit nurse to review:

- Your medical history and current medications
 - If you suspect that you are pregnant, please notify your physician or the nurse at this time, as anesthesia can be harmful to the fetus
- Time and date of your procedure
- Any questions you may have about your procedure
- If you have not received a call from a member of our staff by 3:00 p.m. on the day prior to your procedure, please call us at 270-885-6200

A member of our business office staff may contact you to confirm your insurance coverage and to answer any questions you may have about your financial responsibilities. As part of our efforts to serve our community, we gladly accept Medicare assignment and participate in a number of managed care and insurance programs.

THE NIGHT BEFORE YOUR PROCEDURE

Please do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your procedure, including gum, water, mints, vitamins or tobacco unless a pre-admission nurse has given you special instructions from the anesthesiologist stating otherwise. This is very important for your safety. Failure to do so may result in a delay or cancellation of your procedure.

Persons under 18 must have a parent or legal guardian with them to consent to treatment. This person must remain in the center at all times. Children may keep a small toy or special item with them for comfort. Please bring diapers and a bottle or sippy cup if applicable.



THE MORNING OF YOUR PROCEDURE

- DO NOT eat or drink anything
- DO NOT use tobacco products of any type
- DO NOT wear jewelry, watches, makeup or nail polish
- If you wear glasses, please bring a case with you—no contact lenses please
- The ASC will not be responsible for lost or damaged articles
- DO wear comfortable clothing that you can change easily and will not bind the site of your surgery
- DO remember to bring your insurance card, driver's license and Medicare card (if applicable) with you
- If you do not have a driver's license, another form of identification will be required
- DO arrive at your designated time given by the pre-admission nurse prior to your procedure
- DO bring a family member or friend to wait for you; however, no more than two family members are allowed to visit during recovery

Have someone plan to stay with you through the night once you are discharged. DO NOT drive, make important decisions, or operate machinery for 24 hours after your procedure.
